EVENT: Camp Cod Camping Fun & Rail Trail Ride

WHEN: Friday-Sunday June 18-20, 2021

STAYING WHERE: BSA Camp Greenough Reservation, 227 Pine Street, Yarmouthport, MA 02675

MEETING WHEN: Meet at the Deer Run campsite at Camp Greenough Friday afternoon/evening. Feel free to arrange shared rides as you wish. Expect more traffic heading to the Cape on Friday.

MEALS: To continue Covid caution, cooking will be by Scout/Family. If you are driving, this is car camping. You can bring your own small stove, food, cooking setup. Or hiking food. The Troop will have a large cooler if you need something kept cool. We will also see if campfire tin foil cooking is an option and let you know. Avoid nuts and peanuts as there are allergies in the Troop. Bring food for Friday night – dinner, or snacks as you wish. Saturday you need breakfast, lunch you can take on the bikeride, and dinner back in camp. Sunday you can make breakfast, or eat on the road as you travel home.

AGENDA: This will be another great destination camp-out. Friday evening will be relax in camp. Saturday morning we will travel by car to a parking lot on the Cape Cod Rail Trail and unload the bikes. We will enjoy an approximate 10 mile ride to the beach where we will have lunch and relax. Then we will ride back, probably stopping for ice cream in Orleans. So that's 20 miles round trip. Saturday afternoon we are hoping to set up a lifeguard, and BSA safety requirements to go swimming at the camp waterfront. So swimming TBD. Or you may stay in camp. Fishing in the lake is also popular – no promises on what you'll catch.

We need registrations to know if the Troop needs a trailer to transport bikes. The registration will allow you to request your bike be transported. Also, Camp Greenough also has bikes to rent for \$25 for Saturday. You may also register for this.

WHAT TO BRING: Clothing and equipment for a two-night summer Cape campout. Fishing gear (if you have it.) Avoid cotton, bring layers.

You must supply your own **bike helmet** and wear it! Bring a backpack for the ride to have a drink and lunch. Also a bikelock.

Trip registration will also allow you to request a troop tent if needed.

. *Bring appropriate clothing for the time of year and an extra change of clothing in case you get wet. So please bring additional layers for warmth if needed (as it may still get chilly in the evening.)

COST: \$15 per person – Scout or adult

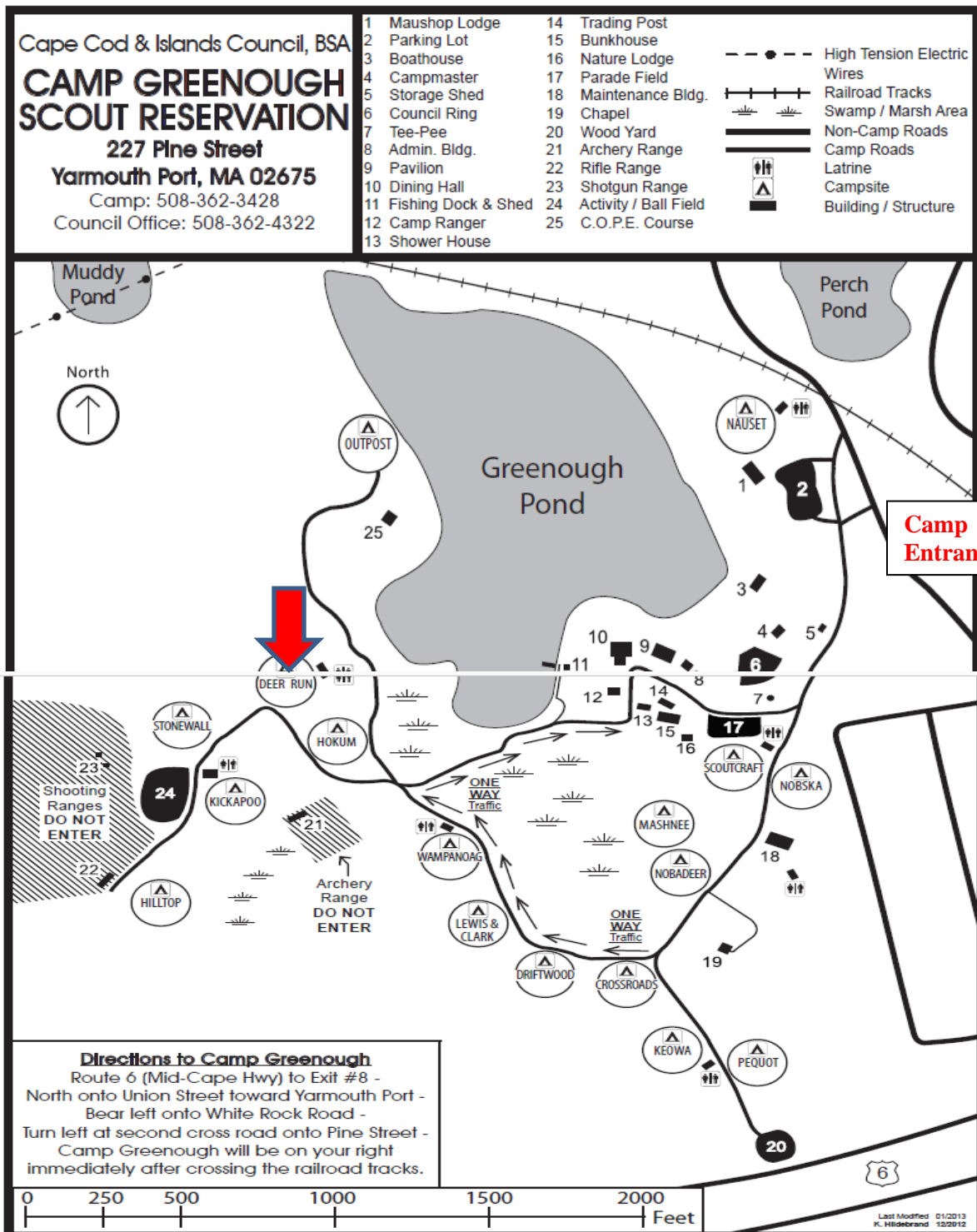

Camp Greenough

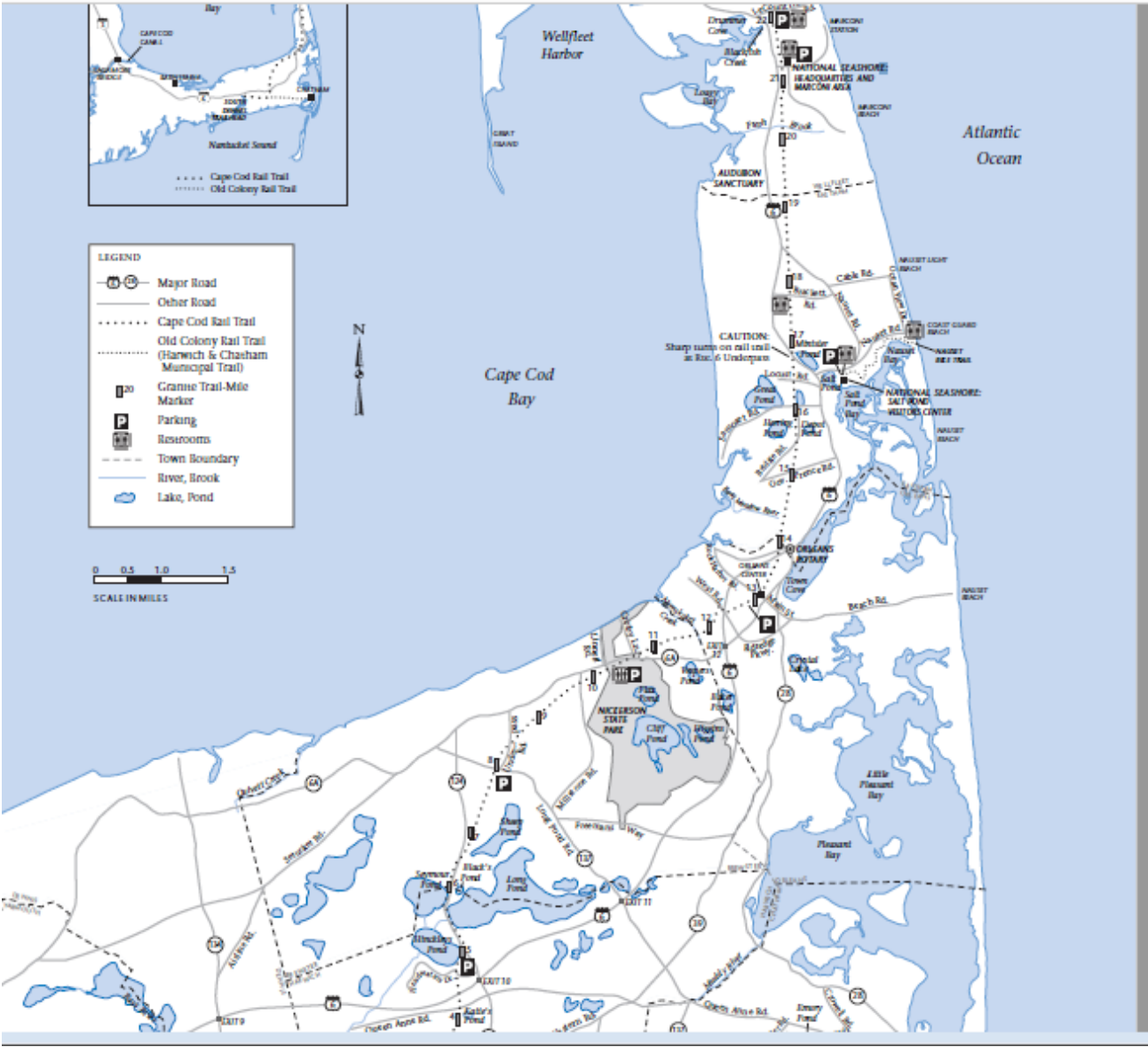
Cars can access all the campsites. There is a good dirt road running thru the wooded camp, with signage showing directions and campsites.

SOME KEY BSA AND TROOP 1 CAMPING RULES

PERMISSION SLIPS – Every scout attending campouts must have completed permission slip.

POCKET KNIVES – Pocket knives are a part of scouting and an important tool for use in the outdoors. It is very important that scouts be taught to use and handle them safely and properly. The privilege of using a pocket knife will be taken away from any scout who misuses or mishandles the pocket knife per the discretion of troop leader(s).

ALCOHOL, DRUGS, AND OTHER PROHIBITED MATERIALS AND ACTIVITIES – National Boy Scout policy prohibits the possession of, or use of, intoxicating beverages in any form, or any controlled substance, including, but not limited to, marijuana, cocaine, beer, wine, or hard liquors by either scouts or parents during scout functions. Fireworks and explosives are strictly prohibited for safety sake. Pornographic materials or the use of obscene language is inappropriate and not permitted.

CONSERVATION – We take care of the outdoors. We do not cut any living tree, shrub, or bush. Leave no trace.

INITIATIONS, HAZING, NAME CALLING & FIGHTING – These do not belong in scouting! Under BSA policy, these situations are regarded as child abuse or inappropriate behavior, and will not be tolerated.

SMOKING – Cigarettes, cigars or the use of any tobacco products by scouts is prohibited. Adults must smoke away from scouts and non-smoking adults. Smoking is prohibited in tents, cabins or in any scout building.
